<p>As a class start a KWL (know, want to know, learned) chart on eagle feathers.</p> <p>Discuss the ceremonial importance of the Eagle in first nations cultures. P54 <i>Keepers of the Animals</i> by Bruchac and Caduto</p> <p>Why would the eagle feather be a symbol for love? Power? Majesty? All seven teachings?
